

Citations and Reference

It is very important to correctly format the references. Here, the references have been formatted according to the IEEE style. For example, Lamport [1] and Faugeras and Long [2] are books. See how the author, the italicized title, the edition, the publisher and the year are included. Kalman [3] and Papenberg *et al.* [4] are journal papers (articles or transactions). Viola *et al.* [5] is a reference to a conference paper. References to conference proceedings must include where the conference was held. Bem [6] is a book chapter. In fact, Bem [6] is a good article for one to read about writing a good paper. References to web sites are discouraged, but may be included if absolutely necessary along with the date accessed. For example, motivation, problem statement, approach, results, and conclusions are the important constituents of an abstract [7]. You may order your references according to the order of citing them.
